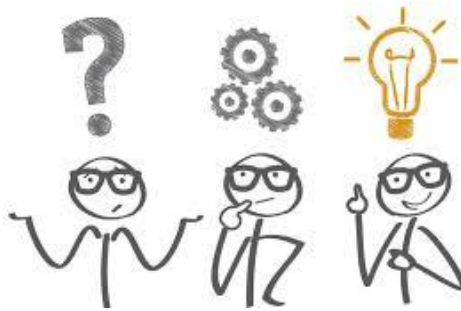

A compound verb to describe existence

- **Singular**

There is (there's)

There is not (there isn't)

Is there ... ?

There is a very nice car in my neighbour's house.



■ Plural

There are

There are not (there aren't)

Are there ... ?

There are some pictures on the wall.





We can use there is/there are for any sentence

- There is a lawyer in our family, but there isn't any doctor.
- Is there any drugstore around your house?
Yes, there is one next to my house.
- There are some animals in my house, there are two dogs and 3 cats; however, there aren't any birds.
- How many teachers are there in your school?
There are around 30 teachers.





ANY or SOME



- **Some is used for affirmative sentences.**

There is **some** food on the table for you to eat and there is **some** soda.



There are **some** photos on my desk . There are **some** books too.

- **Any is used for negative and interrogative sentences.**

There isn't **any** fruit in the fridge. There aren't **any** vegetables either.

Are there **any** good films on TV this week? No, there isn't **any**.

Is there **any** good product to buy in the supermarket? Yes, there are **many**.

Prepositions of location



We can use any preposition of location with **THERE IS / THERE ARE** to show location.



Location examples

- Are there any restaurants **around** your house?

Yes, there is one **across** the street **from** my house and there is another **near** the park.

- There is a great museum **between** Santa Rosa avenue and Real street.
- There aren't any shops **next to** the park, you have to walk **past** the gas station and there are two **on the corner of** Puno and Real streets.
- How many beautiful pictures are there **outside** the studio?
There are about five **outside** and there is one **inside**.
